& Pembroke Coast National Park

The westernmost corner of Wales, with regular ferries to Rosslare in Ireland from both Fishguard and Pembroke. The Coastal Walk is popular with long distance walkers, with many attractions around the National Park and in Tenby itself.

Caldey Island The 20 minute boat trip to Caldey Island is different to any other attraction in Tenby. The quiet religious atmosphere conjured up by the monastic buildings and lifestyle of the residents is reflected in the beautiful and peaceful wooded surroundings.



Picton Castle is a fully developed medieval castle that was transformed into a stately home in the 18th century. Built in 1280, it has been in the Phillips family since 1490 although now managed by the Picton Trust set up by the family.



St David's Cathedral Born in 500, the present cathedral stands on the site of the monastery David founded in the inhospitable area known as 'Glyn Rhosyn.' He rose to become a bishop in the church and made several pilgrimages including one to Jerusalem.



Tudor Merchants House Maintained by the National Trust for 75 years. Until now the house has been decorated and furnished to show the house through different periods of time, but we're now going to show it as it would be in the 1500s.



Pembroke Castle has a long and fascinating past since 1093. It has survived sieges and was the birthplace of King Henry VII in 1457 and survived multiple attacks during the Civil War. It is now managed by a Charitable Trust.



Secret Owl Garden Admission is in addition to Picton Castle, which means you can enjoy all that the castle and gardens have to offer as well as meet the owls and join in with the owl activities. Learn to fly one of the 25 species of Owl in the garden



Tenby Lifeboat Station founded in 1852, the station now operates 2 lifeboats, a Tamar class all-weather Lifeboat and a D class Inshore Lifeboat, earning multiple commendations and awards. Public viewing gallery open 8:30am-5:30pm daily weekdays



Wales Coastal Path Opened in 1970, the Pembrokeshire Coastal Path was the first National Trail in Wales and is one of 15 National Trails in Britain, through some of the most breathtaking coastal scenery in Britain.
