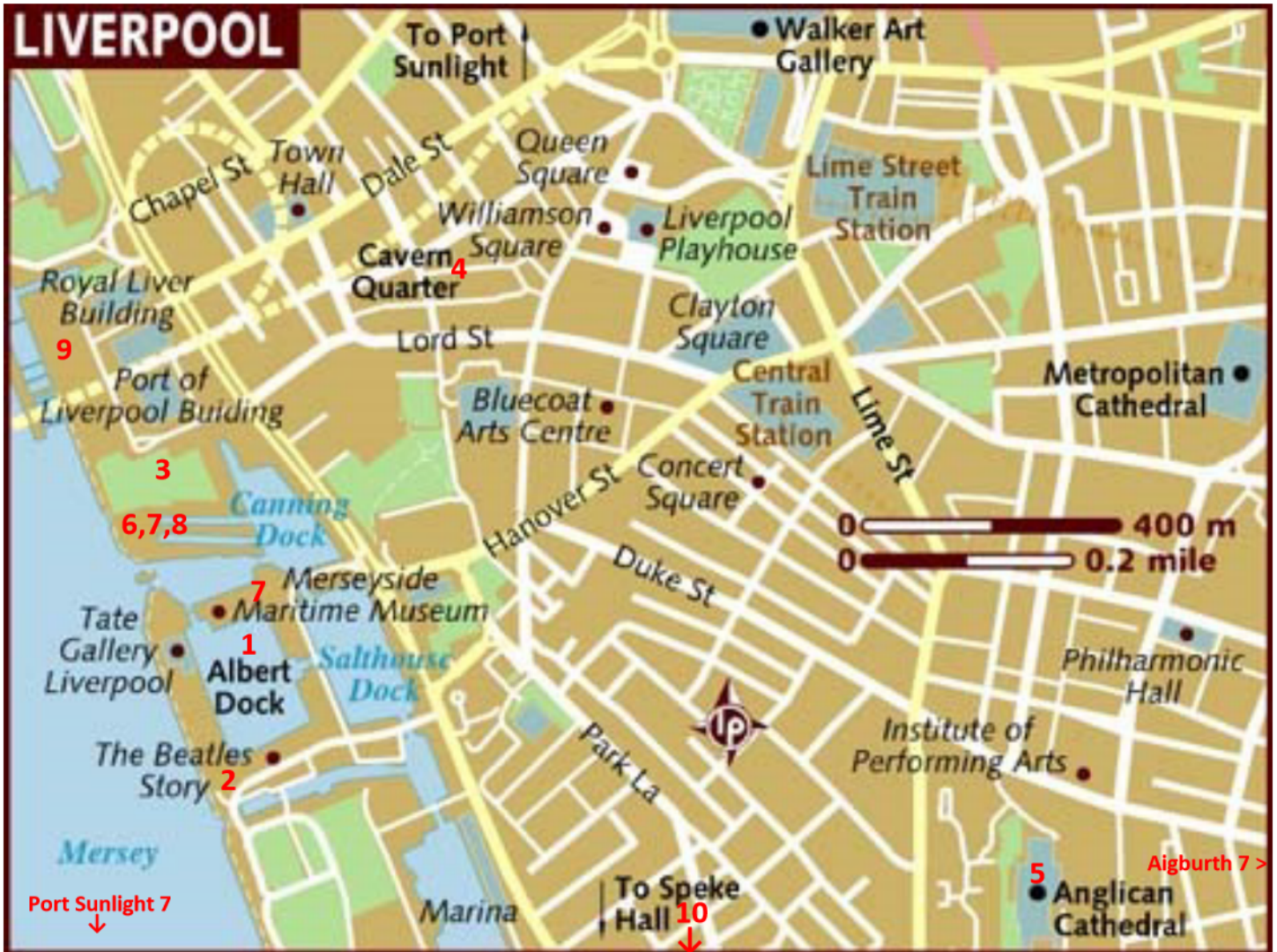




Liverpool

Albert Dock has been on a rollercoaster ride until a complete transformation in 1988. Blending the old and the new, it now proudly holds the title of being one of the most visited tourist attractions in the whole of the UK. Located on Liverpool's incredible World Heritage Site waterfront, it features the largest collection of Grade I listed buildings in the whole country.

Liverpool Anglican Cathedral is Britain's biggest Cathedral and the 5th largest in Europe. The cathedral is free to enter, however the tower and audio tour is highly recommended. Travel to the top of the tower on the 'Tower Experience' and enjoy unrivalled panoramic views from 500ft above sea level!



National Museums of Liverpool consists of 7 diverse and free museums around the city:

- Merseyside Maritime Museum - Albert Dock
- Museum of Liverpool - Pier Head
- Sudley House - Aigburth, 4 miles
- Walker Art Gallery - William Brown Street
- World Museum - William Brown Street

Royal Liver Building opened in 1911, is a Grade I listed building, which along with the neighboring Cunard Building and Port of Liverpool Building is one of Liverpool's *Three Graces*, which line the city's waterfront. It is also part of Liverpool's UNESCO-designated World Heritage Maritime Mercantile City.



Beatles Story the world's largest permanent exhibition purely devoted to the lives and times of The Beatles. Located in the Fab Four's hometown of Liverpool, The Beatles Story takes visitors on an atmospheric journey through the lives, times, culture and music of The Beatles.



Cavern Club is a thriving live music destination and one of Liverpool's top tourist attractions. The three venues – the Cavern Club, Cavern Live Lounge and the Cavern Pub – showcase not only the incredible legacy of The Beatles, but also new up and coming bands and established artists.

Pierhead is a riverside location in the city center. It is part of the Liverpool Maritime Mercantile City UNESCO World Heritage Site, which was inscribed in 2004. As well as a collection of landmark buildings, recreational open space, and a number of memorials, the Pier Head was (and for some traffic still is) the landing site for passenger ships travelling to and from the city.



Speke Hall is a rare Tudor timber-framed manor house in a most unusual setting on the banks of the River Mersey. Restored and brought back to life in the 19th century, it is a unique and beautiful mixture of Tudor simplicity and Victorian Arts and Crafts' aesthetics.
