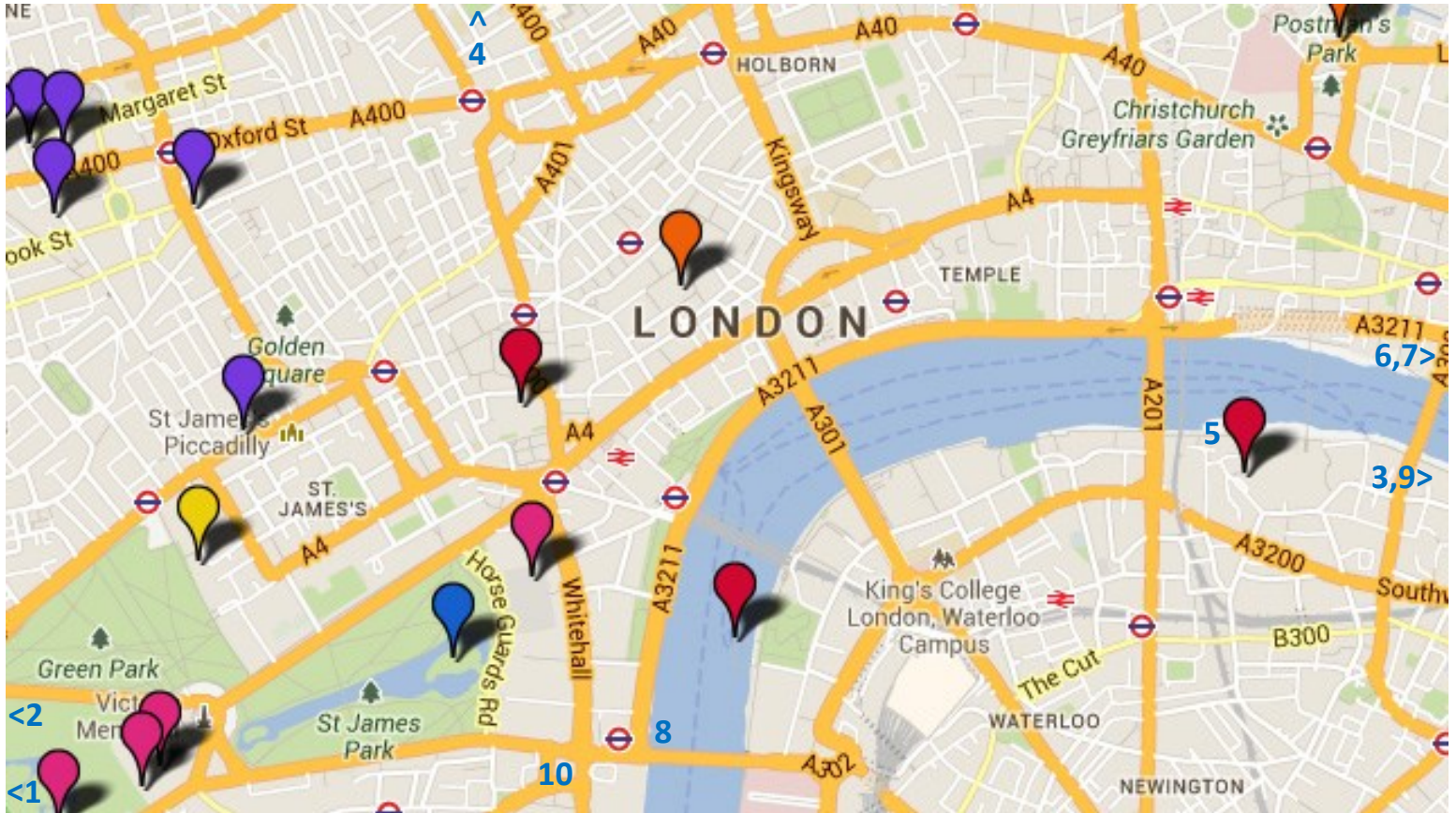

1. Hampton Court Palace

Once the home of King Henry VIII. A sprawling and impressive building, Hampton Court Palace boasts stunning gardens, a world famous hedge maze and the only surviving royal chocolate kitchen dating back to the 17th century.



2. Kensington Palace

Explore the birthplace of Queen Victoria and home to young royals for over 300 years. Walk in the footsteps of royalty in Victoria's re-imagined childhood rooms and the magnificent King's State Apartments and Queen's State Apartments.



3. London Bridge Experience

Prepare to be spooked! Located under the arches of London Bridge, delve into the underworld of this historic city and learn about the most terrible crimes and killings. A visit to the Tombs will also test your courage, so only go if you dare!



4. London Zoo

Opened in London in April 1828, originally intended to be used as a collection for scientific study. In 1831 or 1832, the animals of the Tower of London menagerie were transferred to the zoo's collection. Opened to the public in 1847.



5. Shakespeare's Globe Theatre

An identical reconstruction of the original 16th century open-air playhouse in which Shakespeare directed his world-famous plays. Set on the banks of the River Thames, it's one of London's most iconic buildings



6. Tower Bridge

Dates back to 1894 and was once a symbol of industrial development and London's urban expansion. Now it houses a permanent exhibition which explores the history of the bridge, as well as a new Glass Walkway, giving visitors a unique view over the river.



7. Tower of London

At the top of every guide-book list. Enjoy a tour led by a Yeoman Warder learning tales of history and tragedies. See the Crown Jewels and the oldest attraction in the world - The Line of Kings



8. Thames River Cruise

See London from a different perspective. Regular cruises, with commentary, operate between Westminster and Greenwich, passing Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, London Eye, Shakespeare's Globe and the O2



9. View from the Shard

Journey up to 800ft to the top of London's tallest observation platform and premium visitor attraction to enjoy unparalleled views over London for up to 40 miles, and when the sun goes down the views are even more breathtaking.



10. Westminster Abbey
