


Stratford-upon-Avon

A market town with more than 800 years of history, containing not only many buildings that survive today and would have been familiar to Shakespeare, but also a thriving community offering a wide variety of leisure and shopping experiences.

Not only the place to discover everything Shakespeare, but with the Explorer Pass, valid for 1, 2 or 3 consecutive days, discover 14 other major attractions, within a 25 mile radius, including mighty Warwick Castle.

1. Anne Hathaway's Cottage

The beautiful 500 year cottage old where Shakespeare courted his bride-to-be. See original furniture including the Hathaway bed and uncover five centuries of stories in this picturesque cottage and 13 generations of the family who lived there.

3. **Garrick Inn & Harvard House**

The oldest pub in town. a timber framed building dating back to the 1400's. A rich history including plagues, fires and priest holes.

Harvard House next door was the home of the founder of Harvard University.

5. **Mary Arden's Farm**


Discover the childhood home of Shakespeare's mother. Experience the sights, sounds and smells of a working Tudor farm. Meet the Tudors who run the farm just as Shakespeare's mother would have done.

7. Shakespeare's Birthplace

Walk in Shakespeare's footsteps and explore his childhood world. Hear tales of Shakespeare's family life and get up close to rare objects from the world class collections as you discover how the extraordinary poet continues to shape our lives today.

9. Shakespeare's Schoolroom


See where William Shakespeare spent his schooldays, discovered theatre for the first time and was educated and inspired to become the world's greatest playwright.

6. **Royal Shakespeare Theatre**

Home of the Royal Shakespeare Company which presents around 20 productions annually in the RST and Swan theatres in Stratford, London and regionally on tour around Britain. The company also presents works by other Tudor and Jacobean playwrights.



8. Shakespeare's New Place

Shakespeare's home in later life. The home was demolished in 1759, but walk in his footsteps through the memorial garden and meet the man behind the works in a fascinating new exhibition. Discover beautiful gardens and specially-commissioned artworks.

10. The Play's the Thing

Take a magical journey through 100 years of theatre-making in Stratfordupon-Avon. On display are stunning costumes and props from our archives as well as a rare copy of Shakespeare's second folio. Get hands-on with our interactive exhibits.
