“The Gateway to Ireland”

Dublin, capital of the Republic of Ireland, is on Ireland’s east coast at the mouth of the River Liffey. Its historic buildings include Dublin Castle, dating to the 13th century, and imposing St Patrick’s Cathedral, founded in 1191. City parks include landscaped St Stephen’s Green and huge Phoenix Park, containing Dublin Zoo. The National Museum of Ireland explores Irish heritage and culture.

Multi Country Itinerary Advice: Include Ireland as the final country to be visited, for 2 reasons:

1. There is no Airport Departure Tax in Ireland, saving approximately \$100 per passenger
2. Like Canada, Ireland is the only European Country where you clear US Immigration and Customs prior to departure. You therefore arrive in the USA as a domestic flight, avoiding the inevitable arrival delays.

1. Brazen Head

Dublin's oldest pub. Dating from the 12th century, full of character and the haunt of many famous Irishmen. Enjoy fine ales and food.



2. Dublin Castle

Built in the early 14th century on the site of a Viking settlement. Served as the British HQ until 1922 following Independence. Now a government complex.



3. Dublinia

Experience ancient Dublin in Viking and Medieval times. See the sights, smells and sounds of those times.



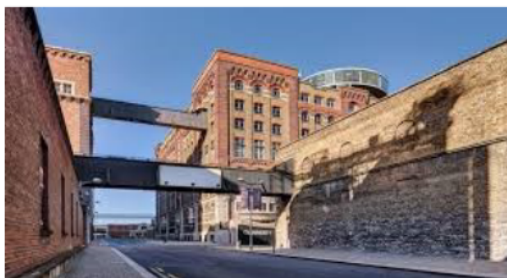
4. EPIC Irish Emigration Museum

Discover what it means to be Irish, with stories of scientists, politicians, poets and even outlaws from all over the world. Saying "I'm Irish" is a great conversation starter.



5. Guinness Storehouse

7 floors of fun and excitement exploring the story of Ireland's most iconic beer. Enjoy panoramic views over the city from the Gravity Bar.



6. Jameson Distillery

Join the only tour of the original Jameson Distillery dating from 1780. Discover the history and heritage as you sample a whiskey tasting.



7. Little Museum of Dublin

Discover the recent history of Dublin. From Queen Victoria to U2; from James Joyce to JFK. You will meet fantastic characters on the FREE guided tours.



8. Malahide Castle & Gardens

Hear family stories of the castle. Explore rooms and collections and discover the central part the castle played in Irish political and social life. 9 miles north.



9. Temple Bar District

Dublin's "Bohemian Quarter". The district, south of the river is full of entertainment, art and culinary action. It is one of the best places to hear live Irish Folk Music.



10. Trinity College & the Book of Kells

The historic college was founded in 1592. Graduates include Oscar Wilde, Bram Stoker and Samuel Beckett. The library houses the manuscript of the "Book of Kells".
