Dundee is a year-round destination. A common time to visit is summer (Jun–Aug) when temperatures are milder and the city enjoys long daylight hours. The Flower and Food Festival (Sep) celebrates Scottish produce with displays and competitions. Other popular events include Dundee Science Festival (Oct/Nov) and Dundee Jazz Festival (Nov). The climate is mild and temperate, with rain throughout the year, but more hours of sunshine than any other Scottish city. Winter brings chilly, damp weather and short daylight.

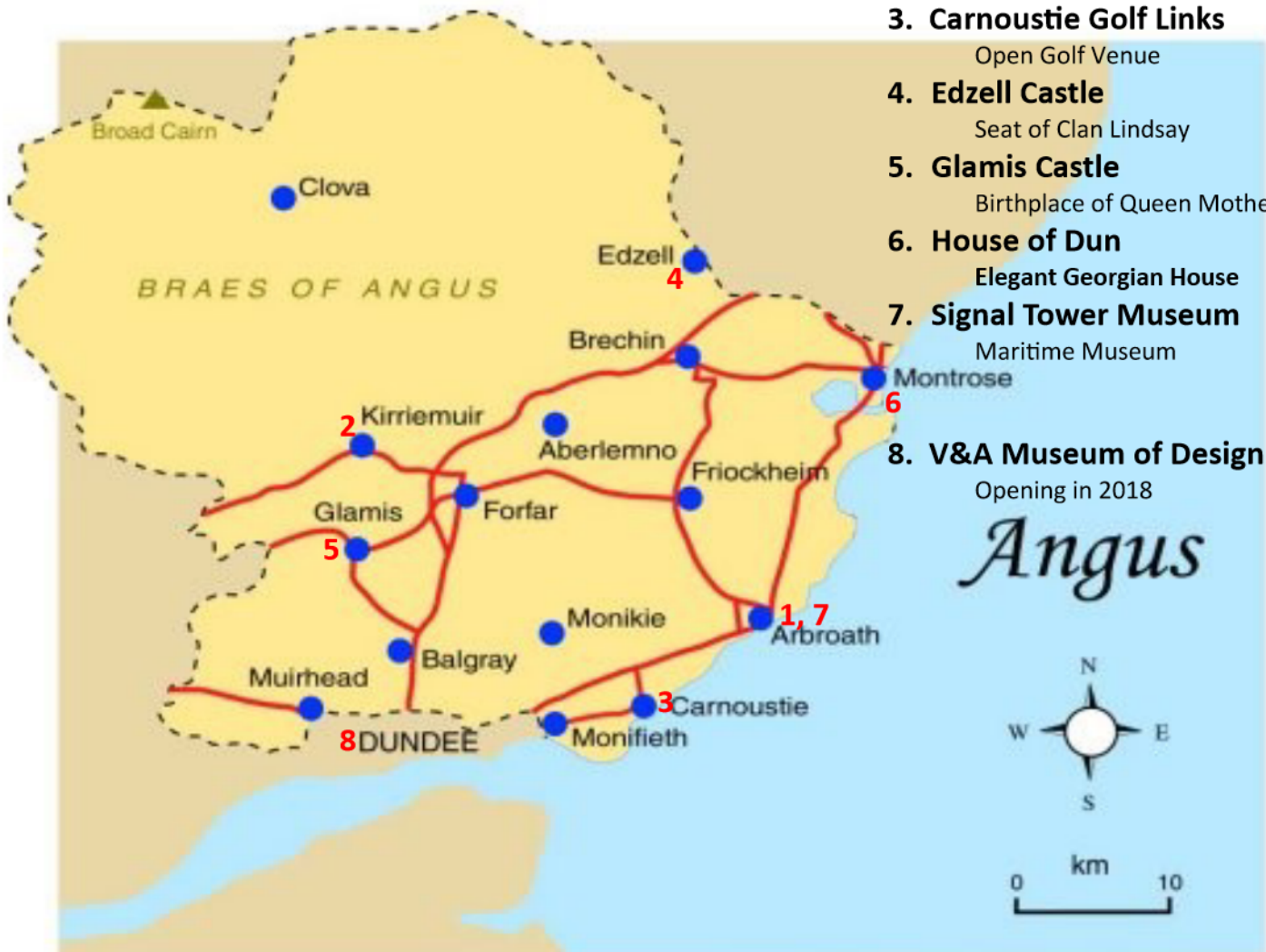

Arbroath Abbey Explore the origins of the most famous document in Scottish history – the Declaration of Arbroath. Scotland’s nobles swore their independence from England in this letter to the Pope, sent from Arbroath Abbey in 1320.



Carnoustie Golf Links The Championship Course has hosted seven Open Championships, one Ladies Open and two Senior Opens making it one of the very few to have done so in the UK. It is one of the three courses used for the annual Alfred Dunhill Links Championship that sees a host of celebrities and professional golfers descend on the course.



Glamis Castle Home to the Earls of Strathmore and Kinghorne, setting for Shakespeare's Macbeth and beloved childhood home of the H.M. Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Glamis Castle has been witness to a thousand years of history. Visits to the castle are by guided tour only and tours leave regularly throughout the day.



Signal Tower Museum Located next to Arbroath's picturesque and historic harbor, within the original shore station for the Bell Rock Lighthouse, Signal Tower Museum tells the story of the lighthouse itself and of the local fishing and maritime industries. 200 years after construction, the Bell Rock Lighthouse still stands as Britain's oldest surviving rock lighthouse, still warning shipping of the jagged Bell Rock.



JM Barrie's Birthplace creator of Peter Pan, spent his childhood in this small whitewashed cottage. Barrie lived with his seven brothers and sisters in two upstairs rooms, while his father's weaving workshop was downstairs. The wash-house in the yard, Barrie's first theatre – and may have inspired the Wendy House in *Peter Pan*.



Edzell Castle Get a sense of the standing of the Lindsay family from the beauty of their lordly seat. Its highlight is the great garden added in 1604, which has enclosing walls featuring decoration unique in Britain. Look inside the tower house, a fine example of a typical 16th-century nobleman's residence.



House of Dun Designed with Georgian pride and baroque extravagance House of Dun is every bit the perfect 18th-century laird's home. It took 13 years to complete and the precision shows in the fine details. The plasterwork in the saloon is masterful – classical tableaux and family emblems rise thickly from the walls and ceilings with filigree flourishes.
