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Angel of the North Since spreading its wings in February 1998, The Angel of the North has become one of the most talked about and recognizable pieces of public art ever produced - winning many accolades and awards along the way. Castle, Newcastle the Castle Keep and its 13th century gatehouse the Black Gate, were once part of a much larger fortress. Given its tumultuous history, it is miraculous that so much of Newcastle's castle has survived



Centre for Life incorporates Life Science Centre, an award-winning visitor attraction and educational facility; research facilities housing young and established biotechnology companies and an internationally-renowned institute belonging to Newcastle University; and two National Health Service (NHS) clinics delivering cutting-edge fertility and regenerative medicine therapies. Although the Science Centre is the public face of Life, the on-site research and clinical work is of equal importance in achieving the Centre's charitable mission.

Great North Museum The Living Planet gallery spans the ground and first floor of the museum. It also features live animal tanks and aquaria. Also on the ground floor, the Hadrian's Wall gallery enables visitors to discover the detailed history of the World Heritage Site as well as finding out about all the forts, milecastles and associated museums that can be visited today.



Segedunum Roman Fort stood at the eastern end of Hadrian's Wall and was home to 600 Roman soldiers. For almost 300 years Segedunum guarded this important part of the frontier. It is once again the gateway to Hadrian's Wall: the ideal place to explore the incredible story of Roman life in the north of England.



Beamish Museum a world famous open air museum, telling the story of life in North East England during the 1820s 1900s & 1940s. Explore towns, villages, collieries, farms, railways and tramways in a full day out for all the family.



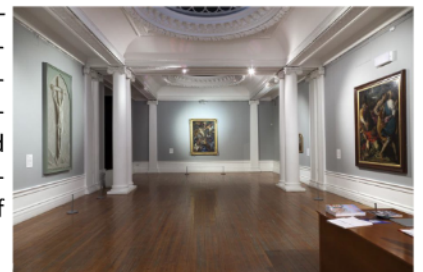
Cathedral, Newcastle The Cathedral Church of St Nicholas, seat of the Bishop of Newcastle is the most northerly Cathedral in England. It is 14th century with the 15th century Lantern Tower. Visitors can find medieval treasure on their journey around the Cathedral which includes a stained glass roundel .

Hatton Gallery reopened in 2017 following a £3.8M refurbishment. The diverse collection includes over 3,000 works from the 14th – 20th centuries with extensive archive material including paintings, sculpture, prints, drawings and textiles, and material connected to the history of the Gallery,



Tyne Bridge Linking Newcastle upon Tyne and Gateshead, the Tyne Bridge is the most celebrated and most iconic of the seven bridges crossing the River Tyne. At the time of its construction the Tyne Bridge was the world's longest single span bridge and was officially opened on 10 October 1928 by King George V.
