## Bedruthan Steps

The dramatic views provide a breathtaking experience. The geology of the cliffs and stacks themselves is intriguing and it's easy to visit without realising that there's a history of mining in the area dating back to the 19th century.



## Boscastle

Maintained by the National Trust, a sheltered natural inlet with an unspoilt harbor village, providing a range of scenic and nature walks.



## Jamaica Inn

built in 1750 as a coaching inn, and immortalized in the Daphne Du Maurier novel – the 18th century equivalent of a modern day service station for weary travelers. Using the turnpike between Launceston and Bodmin, they would stay at the Inn after crossing the wild and treacherous moor.



## Padstow

a charming working fishing port at the head of the Camel River. Watching the everyday ebb and flow of harbor life is a perfect way to spend a day. This foodie destination with popular eateries such as Rick Stein's Seafood Restaurant, is the start and end point for the Camel Cycle Trail.



## St Ives

best approached by the scenic rail line from Lelant Saltings. Major attractions are the harbor, the Tate St Ives Gallery and the Barbara Hepworth Museum and Sculpture Garden. Be sure to visit the "Downlong" with its narrow cobbled streets and fishermen's cottages.



## Bodmin

Experience being a juror in a Victorian murder trial in Shire Hall, then visit the Bodmin Jail, featured in Living TV's "Most Haunted" program. Other attractions include the Regimental Museum and a Steam Railway.



## Cornwall Aviation Heritage Centre

Take the opportunity to take a stroll through the Hardened Aircraft Shelter, sitting in the Hawker Harrier jet along with several other classics. Chat to the experienced team who will only be too happy to tell you about the history and previous roles of our wonderful fleet of cold war aircraft.



## Newquay

hosts many international surfing competitions on Fistral Beach, one of 15 in and around the town. Other attractions include the Blue Reef Aquarium and Newquay Zoo, the Japanese Garden and Trerice House.



## Port Isaac

an attractive fishing village since the early fourteenth century. Its narrow, winding streets are lined with old white-washed cottages and traditional granite, slate-fronted Cornish houses, many of which are listed as of architectural or historic importance.



## Tintagel Castle

Immerse yourself in history, myths and stunning scenery at Tintagel Castle, set high on Cornwall's rugged north coast. For centuries this dramatic castle and coastline has fired the imaginations of writers, artists and even the brother of a king. Now it's your turn to be inspired.
