Attenborough Nature Reserve & Centre With a visionary eco-design, set against the backdrop of the beautiful Attenborough Nature Reserve, the Centre provides a place for visitors to look, learn and refresh.



National Holocaust Centre is so much more than a museum. It's a vibrant memorial, a place of testimony and a Centre of learning for communities of all faiths, and none, across the UK.



Nottingham Castle Historic site at the heart of the Robin Hood legend and starting point for the English Civil War. Situated on a high rock, Nottingham Castle commands spectacular views over the city and once rivalled the great castles of Windsor and the Tower of London.

Southwell Workhouse the best-preserved workhouse in England, the Southwell Workhouse is a reminder of those not-too-fondly remembered days when poor families were forced to live and work in harsh conditions in a forerunner of our modern welfare system.



City of Caves is part of a hidden maze of over 500 original sandstone caves underneath the streets of Nottingham dating back to the dark ages. Take a tour to investigate the social history of the caves and learn more about the events that once happened inside these fascinating underground dwellings.



Newark Castle The largest gateway of any castle in England graces this largely 12th century fortress. The castle once belonged to King John, and it was here that he died in 1216 after his infamous "surfeit of peaches".



Old Market Square Nottingham's 'beating heart' is also the setting for major events and celebrations including the **Riviera Beach** every summer and the **Christmas Winter Wonderland**. You can also buy local produce, including artisan cheese and meats, at the regular farmers' markets which take place throughout the year.



Southwell Minster The nave is a glorious example of Norman architecture, leading to a fine Early English Quire. The 13th Century Chapter House is perhaps the finest feature with some of the best carvings of the natural world in the country and is the great climax of a visit to Southwell.



Wollaton Hall one of the country's finest Grade One listed Elizabethan mansions, set within 500 acres of beautiful parkland. Experience stunning architecture, exhibitions, a packed events program and an array of wildlife. Go behind the scenes on a variety of guided tours available throughout the year
